Just 4 months from now at Homecoming (October 28th) we will mark this occasion by presenting 25 & amp; 50 year membership pins to alumni in attendance who were initiated at least 25 & amp; 50 years ago. Ryan Callahan & amp; Domenic Mularo paid KU a visit during the months of October-December quickly recruiting 7 new members for the chapter, generating hundreds of names of potential new members (PNMs) for the chapter to follow up on and training members in recruitment techniques. Six additional members were added early spring semester. The BOG continues to advise the chapter's recruitment chairman and recruitment committee through Zoom calls, text and Slack communications and believe they are executing a good process to grow the chapter.
