Virtual Homecoming

COVID prevented a traditional Homecoming gathering last year so we did our best to meet on Zoom. We had around 20 alumni and undergraduates attend for an on-line meeting, ran by Graduate Council President Larry Washburn.

The annual meeting was called to order: there was discussion of a potential early 2021 re-chartering. House dues were lowered to help everyone impacted by COVID. Chad King's entertaining Zoom calls have been a highlight in 2020. Larry and Chris Hazlett (Graduate Council treasurer) gave reports on alumni council and financial status:

Alumni: 170 members on Facebook; 560 members per Member Planet database; 158 followers of Instagram. **Finances**: \$1155.00 in the Graduate Council account earmarked for Chiefs watch parties and brotherhood dinners for the colony.

Brian Kresin updated all on the Board of Governors work. Congratulations to Vice President of Alumni Relations Alex Ostrem for publishing an excellent fall newsletter! There was a mention of finding permanent housing for the colony in order to grow – the vacant SDT house was considered but financial terms make this unavailable right now. A feasibility study is being considered.

Recruitment has also been challenging with COVID restrictions: no in person or rush parties allowed so the undergraduates have been clever in their rush efforts. Current membership was mentioned to be 22. The colony members were recognized for their excellent academics!

The GPA of 3.3 was the highest since colonizing in 2018!

Colton Jahr was recognized for the website he created.

The graduate council by-laws were officially approved and Larry, Chris and Dave Deady were voted in as president, treasurer and secretary. The meeting was adjourned at 12:27pm.
